

### Articles of Confederation

**GRADES 4-6**

Teaches students about the Articles of Confederation, what they were, and why they were important to the Constitution.

### Electoral College System

**GRADES 5-6**

Teaches students about the process used to elect the President of the United States.

### Government Types

**GRADES 5-6**

Teaches students the differences between different types of governments.

### Mayflower Compact

**GRADES 4-6**

Students learn to define the Mayflower Compact, explain its purpose and its future impact on democracy in the United States.

### U.S. Presidents

**GRADES 4-6**

Students learn about the office of the Presidency in the United States, focusing on the individual Presidents.

### Bill of Rights

**GRADES 4-6**

Students will be able to define the Bill of Rights, list and summarize the first ten amendments, and apply them to their use in America.

### Emancipation Proclamation

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn about the Emancipation Proclamation, including what it was, what it did, and what its lasting impact on U.S. history is.

### How a Bill Becomes a Law

**GRADES 5-6**

Learn the process by which a bill becomes a law in the United States, also learning the difference between a bill and a law.

### Republicans and Democrats

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn about the two major political parties in the United States.

### Underground Railroad

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn about the Underground Railroad, its historical context, key figures and vocabulary words, and its lasting impact on the United States.

### Checks and Balances

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn about the system of checks and balances present in the United States government between the three branches of government and how they work.

### Executive Branch

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn the history of the Executive branch, how it was conceived, and how it interacts with the other branches of government in the United States.

### Judicial Branch

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn the history of the branch, how it was conceived, and how it interacts with the other branches of government in the United States.

### Three Branches of Government

**GRADES 4-6**

Students learn about the three different branches of government in the United States.

### Washington, D.C.

**GRADES 3-5**

Learn about the history of Washington, D.C. and about significant events in the city's history.

### Declaration of Independence

**GRADES 4-6**

Identifies the Declaration of Independence and its meaning, as well as interprets different parts of the document, including the preamble.

### Gettysburg Address

**GRADES 4-6**

Students read the speech and analyze it in addition to learning about the historical context of it and its lasting impact.

### Legislative Branch

**GRADES 4-6**

Introduces students to the Legislative Branch of the United States.

### Trade and Specialization

**GRADES 5-6**

Students learn to define trade, specialization, and other related terms and concepts; and explain how trade impacts the cost and price of products.

### What is Democracy

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn about democracies, including the characteristics of a democracy, some places in the world that are democracies, and more.

### White House

**GRADES 1-6**

Learn about the White House and their significance, list interesting facts about the White House, and summarize its history.

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### Women's Suffrage

**GRADES 4-6**

Learn about the women's suffrage movement, including key ideas, main figures, major events, and its lasting impact.

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
